Naomi Gjevre is Assistant Professor of Violin at the University of Wyoming, a faculty member at the Interlochen Arts camp and a member of the Lindsayan String Quartet. As a violinist of this ensemble, Ms. Gjevre has held two prestigious residencies. From 1998-2002 she was an Artist in Residence with the Midland-Odessa Symphony and Chorale in Texas, and from 1995 to 1997 an Artist in Residence under a National Endowment for the Arts Chamber Music Residency at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green.

Ms. Gjevre has participated in several music festivals including the Aspen Music Festival, the Bowdoin Summer Music Festival, The Quartet Program, the *Festival Internacional de Música* de Cochabamba in Bolivia, Strings in the Mountains in Colorado and the Snowbird Institute in Utah, among others. In addition, she has performed as concerto soloist with the University of Wyoming Chamber Orchestra and the Trujillo Symphony in Peru.

Additional orchestral experience includes the Savannah Symphony Orchestra, the Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra, and the North Carolina School of the Arts Orchestra with which she toured several European countries including France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, and Italy.

Principal teachers include Karen Clarke, Roland and Almita Vamos, Eliot Chapo and Oswald Lehnert. Ms. Gjevre has participated in master classes given by Janos Starker, Jaap Schroeder (Baroque Violin) and Mitchel Stern. Chamber music coachings have been with the Muir String Quartet and the Takács String Quartet, among others.

Prior to her recent appointment at the University of Wyoming, Ms. Gjevre held teaching positions at Midland College, Odessa College, Western Kentucky University, and a teaching assistantship at Florida State University.
